# Extend Your Righteous Sceptre from Zion

## Psalm 110:2

### Context Psalm 110

<sup>1</sup> *The Lord says to my lord: “Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet.”* <sup>2</sup> ***The Lord will extend your mighty sceptre from Zion, saying, “Rule in the midst of your enemies!”*** <sup>3</sup> *Your troops will be willing on your day of battle. Arrayed in holy splendour, your young men will come to you like dew from the morning’s womb.* <sup>4</sup> *The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind: “You are a priest forever, in the order of Melchizedek.”* <sup>5</sup> *The Lord is at your right hand; he will crush kings on the day of his wrath.* <sup>6</sup> *He will judge the nations, heaping up the dead and crushing the rulers of the whole earth.* <sup>7</sup> *He will drink from a brook along the way, and so he will lift his head high.*

# Extend Your Righteous Sceptre from Zion

## Psalm 110 - elements of Jesus jurisdiction

*luris* = law; *dicere* = to speak (diction)

*Meaning = Extend or range of power / authority*

1. Over the whole earth
2. Over sin and death
3. Over the volunteer army
4. Over the Priesthood
5. Over the battle
6. Over the victory

# Extend Your Righteous Sceptre from Zion

## Psalm 110:2

*The Lord will extend your mighty sceptre from Zion, saying, “Rule in the midst of your enemies!”*

1. The Lord
2. Will extend
3. Your Righteous sceptre
  - Righteous = divine, upright, God ordained
  - Sceptre = symbol of royal authority
  - *Matteh* = same as staff

# Extend Your Righteous Sceptre from Zion

## Hebrews 1:8-9

*<sup>8</sup> But about the Son he says, “Your throne, O God, will last for ever and ever; a sceptre of justice will be the sceptre of your kingdom. <sup>9</sup> You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has set you above your companions by anointing you with the oil of joy.”*

## Matthew 22:17-21

*17 Tell us then, what is your opinion? Is it right to pay the imperial tax to Caesar or not?"*

*18 But Jesus, knowing their evil intent, said, "You hypocrites, why are you trying to trap me? 19 Show me the coin used for paying the tax." They brought him a denarius, 20 and he asked them, "Whose image is this? And whose inscription?"*

*21 "Caesar's," they replied.*

# Moses and jurisdiction

## Exodus 2:11-15

*<sup>11</sup> One day, after Moses had grown up, he went out to where his own people were and watched them at their hard labour. He saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew, one of his own people. <sup>12</sup> Looking this way and that and seeing no one, he killed the Egyptian and hid him in the sand. <sup>13</sup> The next day he went out and saw two Hebrews fighting. He asked the one in the wrong, “Why are you hitting your fellow Hebrew?”*

*<sup>14</sup> The man said, **“Who made you ruler and judge over us? Are you thinking of killing me as you killed the Egyptian?”** Then Moses was afraid and thought, “What I did must have become known.”*

*<sup>15</sup> When Pharaoh heard of this, he tried to kill Moses, but Moses fled from Pharaoh and went to live in Midian, where he sat down by a well.*

# Partnership with Almighty

## Exodus 3:13-15

<sup>13</sup> *Moses said to God, “Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, ‘**The God of your fathers has sent me to you,**’ and they ask me, ‘What is his name?’ Then what shall I tell them?”*

<sup>14</sup> *God said to Moses, “I am who I am. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: ‘I am has sent me to you.’”* <sup>15</sup> *God also said to Moses, “Say to the Israelites, ‘The Lord, the God of your fathers—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob—has sent me to you.’ “This is my name forever, the name you shall call me from generation to generation.*

# Speak/diction

## Exodus 4:10, 12

*Moses said to the Lord, “Pardon your servant, Lord. I have **never been eloquent**, neither in the past nor since you have spoken to your servant. I am slow of speech and tongue.”*

*Now go; I will help you speak and will teach you what to say.”*
